TRAINING SQUADRON TWENTY-SEVEN INSTRUCTION 1542.2A

Subj: POLICY ON STUDENT MILITARY AVIATOR UNSATISFACTORY EVENTS AND
COMMAND DIRECTED FINAL PROGRESS CHECKS

1. Purpose. To promulgate Training Squadron TWENTY-SEVEN (VT-27) policy on the administrative processing of unsatisfactory primary flight training events and performance standards requiring a Command Directed Final Progress Check (CDFPC).

2. Cancellation. VT-27INST 1542.2

3. Background. This instruction provides command policy on uniform requirements and timeline goals for processing Student Military Aviator (SMA) unsatisfactory training events. In addition, per references (a) through (c), the CDFPCs are permitted when successful completion of the flight program is in doubt. This instruction is intended to provide additional command guidance and standardization on performance standards requiring a CDFPC.

4. Policy

a. A SMA who is awarded an unsatisfactory on any training event (academic, ready room, flight, or simulator) shall route their Aviation Training Jacket (ATJ) via the VT-27 Chain of Command upon release from the unsatisfactory training event. If the debrief of the unsatisfactory event is completed prior to 1200, the SMA shall report to Student Control no later than 1330 in Khakis (USN) or Service Charlie (USMC). If the unsatisfactory debrief is completed after 1200, the SMA shall report to Student Control at 0730 on the next work day in the above specified uniform. If reporting at 0730 the day after the unsatisfactory event, the SMA will be prepared to fly the next event in their syllabus. The SMA shall wait in the Student Ready Room during normal working hours until the routing is complete. If there is a conflict or question, the SMA shall contact the Operations Duty Officer (ODO) or their Flight Leader for further guidance.

b. In addition to the requirements outlined in references (a) and (b), the following guidance applies to all SMA's assigned to VT-27:

(1) An SMA who accrues three (3) unsatisfactory events or any combination of five (5) unsatisfactory or marginal events, to include academics, in a single stage of training (contact, instrument, form...), shall be considered for a CDFPC.

(2) An SMA who accrues five (5) unsatisfactory events or any combination of seven (7) unsatisfactory or marginal events, to include academics, in primary flight training, shall be considered for a CDFPC.

(3) An SMA who accrues two (2) unsatisfactory ready room briefs in any stage shall be considered for a CDFPC.

(4) An SMA whose block NSS, or overall NSS, is in jeopardy of falling below 30 shall be considered for a CDFPC.
