1. Purpose. This instruction provides a standardized guide for initial reporting, investigation procedures, and subsequent action required in the event of a non-aviation mishap or event requiring special incident reporting involving personnel under the cognizance of Commander, Training Air Wing FIVE (CTW-5).

2. Cancellation. COMTRAWINGFIVEINST 3750.7

3. Discussion. The primary concern following a mishap is to prevent loss of life and destruction of property by rescuing mishap victims and extinguishing fires. Safeguarding wreckage and preserving mishap evidence is a secondary concern. This instruction, along with references (a) through (f) set forth the requirements, conditions, and general procedures to follow in the submission of reports, conduct of investigations, and promulgation of other administrative correspondence associated with ground (non-aircraft) mishaps.


4. Action. This Pre-Mishap Plan pertains primarily to the duties of the Training Air Wing (TRAWING) FIVE Command Duty Officer (CDO) in the event of a ground (non-aviation related) mishap. All personnel shall be made aware of the following requirements:

a. General. Any person having knowledge of a mishap involving damage (no matter how slight) to property or injury to personnel shall report such facts to the TRAWING FIVE CDO immediately at (850) 637-2793. Except as provided for in this instruction, personnel shall not divulge any information, officially or unofficially, to any other party.

b. Specific. This instruction and enclosure (1) are provided to assist action officers in the event of a mishap. Deviation from the step-by-step procedures in this instruction is permitted; however each step shall be completed as soon as possible. All personnel assigned responsibilities herein shall familiarize themselves with this instruction. Mishaps shall not be discussed with persons outside the Command until information has been released by proper authority.

c. Nothing in this instruction shall preclude additional logical action should the situation warrant.

5. Changes. Proposed changes or updates to this instruction shall be forwarded to the TRAWING FIVE Safety Officer via email or phone at x7063.

GROUND (NON-AVIATION) PRE-MISHAP PLAN

USE THIS PRE-MISHAP PLAN ONLY IF AN INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN INJURED IN ANY WAY IN A MISHAP THAT IS NOT DIRECTLY RELATED TO NAVAL AIRCRAFT.

GROUND (NON-AVIATION) MISHAP DESCRIPTION

NAVAL AIRCRAFT NOT involved. Any of the following whether on or off-duty:

1. Personnel injury, death, or occupational illness.
2. Material (property) damage in excess of \$50,000.
3. Explosive mishap or conventional ordnance deficiencies.
4. Motor vehicle fatality or injury.
5. Diving mishap, hyperbaric treatment, death.

NOTE: This includes any automobile or recreational mishaps, injuries in workshops or hangars (not involving aircraft).

INITIAL NOTIFICATION

STEP 1: Record all available information on the Initial Notification Worksheet (Tab 1).

STEP 2: Notify the Squadron Duty Officer (SDO) immediately if the personnel is attached to a squadron. In the event of death or serious injury ensure the Commodore (COMO), the Squadron Commanding Officer (CO) if applicable, Deputy COMO, Chief Staff Officer (CSO), and Casualty Assistance Calls Officer (CACO) are notified to initiate primary and secondary next of kin notification. Do not release the victim's name to anyone outside the chain of command. Recall numbers are listed in Tab A.

Note: Death or serious injury to personnel or civilians MAY require an OPREP-3 Report (see Tab 2).

STEP 3: For non-fatal, non-serious mishaps, notify the Safety Office (x7063) within 24 hrs or the next working day. Have the personnel's supervisor initiate reporting of the mishap in ESAMS (Enterprise Safety Applications Management System). Give the report (from Tab 1) and all other information associated with the mishap to the Ground Safety Officer. The Ground Safety Officer will report the mishap in compliance with reference (a).


STEP 4: If the mishap is a Private Motor Vehicle (PMV) accident, notify the Safety Department. The Safety Officer will complete the initial notification via WESS.


STEP 5: If the mishap generates news media inquiries, record the names and contact numbers from the inquiring agencies and contact the CNATRA Public Affairs Officer (PAO) - refer to Tab A.

STEP 6. If USAF, USMC, USCG personnel or foreign nationals were injured, notify the parent service - refer to Tab 3.

## OPREP-3 REPORTS

**Telephone Report, if required, is to be made within 5 minutes.**  
**Message Report, if required, is to be made within 60 minutes.**

1. An OPREP-3 report is required if the mishap is likely to generate international/national level interest or is of high U.S. Navy interest. The basic criteria are contained in references (c) and (d). Use the "OPREP-3 Classification Chart" provided in this tab and the following guidance to aid in OPREP-3 classification:

a. OPREP-3P (PINNACLE). Used by any unit to notify the National Command Authority (NCA) and appropriate Naval Commanders of any incident or event where national level interest is indicated, not restricted to reporting operational information (e.g., an incident involving chemical or biological agents, to include anthrax). Although it is possible, it is not likely that TRAWING FIVE will routinely use this report.

b. OPREP-3NB (NAVY BLUE). This report is used to notify the CNO and other Naval Commanders of information concerning incidences of military, political, or press interests which are of high Navy, vice national level, interest (e.g., civilian traffic accident deaths caused by a service member).

c. OPREP-3 UNIT SITUATION REPORTS (UNIT SITREPs). Used by any unit commanding officer, officer-in-charge, or other commander to provide operational commanders and higher authority with timely notification of the status of situational events that do not require an OPREP-3P or OPREP-3NB. Voice Reports may be required for UNIT SITREPs.

2. If any of the criteria in the above paragraphs are met, proceed as follows:

a. If there is any question as to whether or not an OPREP-3 report is required, seek additional guidance from (listed in the order of priority) the CDO, Senior Watch Officer (SWO), CSO, or Administrative Officer (AO). If none of these individuals can be reached prior to the initial five minute deadline for the telephone report, release the voice report and continue to attempt to contact those individuals.

b. In the case of an OPREP-3 report, timeliness is more important than completeness. Do not delay an initial report in order to gain additional information.

c. Select the correct OPREP-3 message for the mishap and use the voice/message report formats provided in this tab.

d. Initial Voice Report. **Within five minutes** of knowledge of the incident, whenever an OPREP-3P or OPREP-3NB is required, an initial voice report (via telephone) shall be made to COMPACFLT. Most UNIT SITREPs do not require voice reports; however, some do. OPREP-3 NAVY UNIT SITREP reports for personnel incidents are examples that require a voice message report. See reference (d), chapter 5, paragraph 3 for more details (retained in TRAWING FIVE Admin or Safety). If time allows, make an attempt to contact the COMO prior to making a voice report. No prior authorization from CTW-5 is necessary to make an initial voice report. Use the phone number and format provided in this tab for making the COMPACFLT call. Anytime an OPREP-3 is required, a telephone call shall be made to the TRAWING FIVE Operations Officer, CSO, Deputy COMO, COMO, Chief of Naval Air Training (CNATRA), and Commander, Naval Air Forces (CNAF). e. Message Report. **Within sixty minutes** of knowledge of the incident, the initial message report is to be made. OPREP-3s reported as TRAWING FIVE events require prior verbal approval of the COMO, Deputy COMO or, in their absence, the CSO. All can be reached at the phone numbers listed in Tab A.

(1) The TRAWING FIVE CDO will initiate the drafting of the message report and contact the TRAWING FIVE Admin for final message preparation and release in accordance with reference (c).

(a) During normal working hours (0730-1600), contact the Admin desk (refer to Tab A).

(b) After hours, contact the AO or the AO Executive Assistance (refer to Tab A).

f. Unless otherwise directed, follow-on reports of the mishap will be submitted by message and continued for as long as directed. Do not delay an initial report in order to gain additional information.

## MISHAP INVOLVING USAF, USMC, USCG PERSONNEL OR FOREIGN NATIONALS

1. Whenever USAF, USMC, USCG personnel or foreign nationals are involved in a mishap, the parent service shall be notified. Contact the parent service liaison office (refer to Tab A) and provide the following information:

- a. Name and rank of member (**obtain command authorization prior to releasing names of killed/injured personnel**)
- b. Unit assigned
- c. Date, time, place of occurrence
- d. Fatality or extent of injury
- e. Location of injured member
- f. If fatality, location of remains
- g. Any additional relevant information
- h. Contact number at your unit

2. In the event of death, serious injury, hospitalization, involvement in any accident or incident involving an International Military Student (IMS), or whenever the commanding officer deems appropriate, a Casualty Report (format provided in this tab) shall be submitted by the cognizant command in accordance with reference (f).

- a. The initial casualty report shall be submitted within 12 hours of the occurrence by priority message.

- b. Have the International Military Student Officer (IMSO) (refer to Tab A) review the message if the situation permits.

- c. Obtain command approval prior to message release.

- d. Contact TRAWING FIVE Admin for final message preparation and release in accordance with reference (c).

- (1) During normal working hours (0730-1600), contact the Admin desk (refer to Tab A).

- (2) After hours, contact the AO or the AO Executive Assistance (refer to Tab A).

- e. Progress reports shall be made when appropriate and shall include a final report indicating the date the IMS is returned to duty.
