Subj: NAVY SWIM TESTER COURSE

1. Purpose. To publish the curriculum for training Student Military Aviators (SMA) in the Navy Swim Tester Course.
2. Action. This curriculum is effective on receipt. No changes will be made without written authorization by the Chief of Naval Air Training (CNATRA).
3. Records Management. Records created as a result of this instruction, regardless of media and format, must be managed per Secretary of the Navy Manual 5210.1 of January 2012.
4. Review and Effective Date. Per this instruction, OPNAVINST 5215.17A, CNATRA N7 will review this instruction annually around the anniversary of its effective date to ensure applicability, currency, and consistency with Federal, DoD, SECNAV, and Navy policy and statutory authority using OPNAV 5215/40 Review of Instruction. This instruction will be in effect for 10 years, unless revised or cancelled in the interim, and will be reissued by the 10-year anniversary date if it is still required, unless it meets one of the exceptions in OPNAVINST 5215.17A paragraph 9. Otherwise, if the instruction is no longer required, it will be processed for cancellation as soon as the need for cancellation is known following the guidance in OPNAV Manual 5215.1 of May 2016.
5. Forms. The CNATRA forms required by this instruction are automated in the Training Learning Management System (T/LMS) computer program. Additional CNATRA forms are available on the CNATRA website <https://www.cnatra.navy.mil/pubs/forms.htm>.

#### 1. Syllabus Management

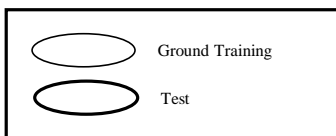
- a. Distribution. Course material will be utilized for personnel enrolled in the course.

#### 2. Training Management. To graduate from this course the student must:

- a. Pass the Lifeguard in-test.
- b. Attend the entire course and participate in all course sessions.
- c. Actively participate in all course activities, including assuming roles in various activities during scenarios.
- d. Demonstrate competency in all required skills.
- e. Pass the final skills scenarios.
- f. Pass the Navy First class swim test.
- g. Successfully pass final written exams with a minimum grade of 80 percent.
- h. If a participant fails to reach the minimum 80 percent on any of the final written exams, a retest will be allowed using another version of the exam.
- i. If a student already possesses a current lifeguard certification or equivalency in accordance with the NETC P1552/16, then the lifeguard portion of the course may be waived.
