1. Purpose. To promulgate the schedule and assign responsibilities for a one-day site visit by Rear Admiral Dell Bull, CNATRA.
2. Background. Event will be centralized at the Naval Air Station Meridian Hangar. Rear Admiral Bull will be on board Naval Air Station (NAS) Meridian 6 August 2015 as part of his routine site visits to each of the CNATRA Training Air Wings and their respective bases. Admiral's Call for Student Naval Aviators and for Instructor Pilots are critical elements of the CNATRA visit. Rear Admiral Bull will also meet with the NAS Meridian Commanding Officer.
3. Action. Assignment of Responsibilities, Schedule of Events and Points of Contact are attached as enclosures (1) through (3) respectively.
4. Uniform. The uniform for military personnel is flight suit, or as briefed. The dress for civilians will be appropriate working attire.

ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Captain Paul Carelli, Commander Training Wing ONE (CTW-1). Serve as the Official Host.
2. Commander Taz Lumpkin, TW-1 Chief Staff Officer. Serve as TW-1 liaison officer and as overall coordinator. Coordinate with Commodore's Secretary and Aide to CNATRA to ensure that vehicle arrangements are in place. Schedule meeting with NAS Meridian Base Commanding Officer, CAPT Scott Bunnay. Schedule meetings with Meridian Military Team Chairman, Mr. Lamar McDonald, Mississippi Council of the Navy League President, Mr. Mike Reed, Squadron Commanding Officers, Instructor Pilots, Student Naval Aviators, Maintenance Support Personnel and Simulator Support Personnel.
3. Commander Weyenberg, TW-1 Operations Officer. Schedule Wing spaces for meeting. Lieutenant Commander Rauenhorst, TW-1 Assistant Operations Officer, will assist as necessary.
4. Lieutenant Commander Rauenhorst, TW-1 Assistant Operations Officer. Provide appropriate "Welcome Aboard" marquee message at flight line entrance. Prepare flight line VIP parking space (1-star slider insert) and hoist the Admiral's Flag. Coordinate Duty Driver responsibilities and Command Vehicles for use by other members of the Admiral's official party.
5. All TW-1 and Squadron Personnel. Ensure all workspaces are clean and presentable.
6. Commanding Officer, NAS Meridian, is requested to provide the following support:
 - a. "Welcome Aboard" marquee (main gate), main side 1-star flag, VIP parking.
 - b. Galley preparations for informal CNATRA lunch on 06 August, party of 8, 11:00 hours.
 - c. Other Public Affairs, grounds preparation and protocol assistance as may be appropriate.

United States Navy Biography

Rear Admiral Dell Bull Chief of Naval Air Training



Rear Admiral Dell Bull is a native of Oak Harbor, Washington. He is a 1988 graduate of the University of Idaho, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Science.

Designated a Naval Flight Officer in September 1989, RDML Bull's early flying assignments as a Bombardier Navigator include VA-128 at NAS Whidbey Island and VA-196 aboard USS Independence (CV 62) during Operation DESERT SHIELD. He was assigned to VF-101 as one of the first NFOs selected for transition to the F-14 Tomcat community and again as an instructor, later reporting to VF-24 aboard the USS Nimitz (CVN 68), flying missions in support of Operation SOUTHERN WATCH, and VF-14 aboard the USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN 71), where he was selected as the NFO of the Year for his combat performance and tactical expertise.

Shore tours include a Legislative Fellow tour with Senator John McCain, Senior Policy Officer on the Joint Staff (J-34 Anti-Terrorism Office), Aviation Program Manager in the Office of Legislative Affairs, and most recently the Chief of

Staff for Commander, Naval Air Forces Pacific (CNAF).

Command operational assignments include the VFA-41 Black Aces aboard USS Nimitz (CVN 68), VFA-122 Flying Eagles, the west coast F/A-18A-F Fleet Replacement Squadron, and Carrier Air Wing NINE aboard USS John C. Stennis (CVN 74).

RDML Bull assumed command as Chief of Naval Air Training in July 2015.

His decorations include the Legion of Merit with two Gold Stars, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2 awards), Air Medal (3 awards with Combat "V"), Strike/Flight Medal (6 awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal with a Gold Star, Navy Achievement Medal (2 awards) and various campaign, unit, and service awards. He has accumulated more than 4,800 flight hours and more than 950 arrested landings.
