1. Purpose. To promulgate specific information and assign duties and responsibilities for a DET of aircraft and personnel from TW-1 to Cecil Field, FL from 26 August 2016 until CQ completion on or about 2 September 2016. The mission of this DET is to complete CQ of approximately 20 SNAs.

2. Concept of Operations. VT-9 is the overall lead for CNATRA. On or about 26 August, 20 aircraft will proceed from NMM to VQQ. Individual Squadron Commanders will be responsible for the transportation arrangements of all required personnel not flying in T-45s to Cecil Field, FL; these individuals will depart Jackson, MS via comair on or about 26 August. Flight operations will include CQ operations onboard USS GEORGE HW BUSH (CVN 77) in addition to FCLP operations at NMM and NEN, as required. A course rules brief for students will be conducted by TW-1 LSO on 24 August. Hook down is scheduled for 28 August. CQ operations are scheduled for completion on or around 2 September. A total of 20 SNAs will participate in the CQ DET. A total of 20 TW-1 aircraft will operate from VQQ for CQ. On or about 2 September, 20 CQ aircraft will RTB to Meridian. Squadron Commanders remain responsible for the return transportation arrangements of all required personnel not flying in T-45s. This is a working document; all dates are subject to change without notice.

- a. Student CQ flights are limited to daylight hours.
- b. No aircraft will depart the DET site without approval from TW-1 DET OIC.
- c. Operations conducted outside of part-time Class D airspace hours at VQQ are approved to meet operational requirements.

3. Responsibilities

a. All individuals will pick up orders, to include lodging, from their respective squadron administrative office prior to departure from NMM.

b. The TW-1 DET OIC shall:

- (1) Be responsible for all administrative and operational actions during the DET.
- (2) Ensure safety takes priority in all decision making.
- (3) Ensure full compliance with references (a) and (b).

c. The TW-1 DET AOIC shall:

- (1) Report directly to the TW-1 DET OIC.
- (2) Promulgate, monitor, and control the TW-1 daily flight schedule.
- (3) Ensure that a T-45C NATOPS qualified instructor is present in the DET Ready Room whenever T-45C flight operations are conducted.
- (4) Coordinate with the CNATRA DET OIC/AOIC concerning trap requirements, duty LSOs, RDOs, and SDOs.
- (5) Coordinate movement of LSOs and Pri-Fly/CATCC Representatives to and from the ship.
- (6) Facilitate efficient and orderly movement of squadron personnel to and from the DET site.
- (7) Ensure compliance with CNATRA and TW-1 SOPs for flight operations.
- (8) Ensure local course rules brief is provided to all DET aircrew.
- (9) Ensure DET packout is inventoried and checked in/out with proper authority.
- (10) Ensure that all IT personnel are on the DET site and all TIMS and associated IT equipment is set up and operating properly. This should be coordinated with Mr. Daniel Cyr, CNATRA N631, (361) 961-5390. The POC for any IT issues that may arise while on DET from 0600 to 1800 CST and after hours is CNATRA ESC, (361) 879-8490.

d. The DET Safety Officer(s) shall:

- (1) Be responsible for all safety related issues associated with the CQ DET.
- (2) Ensure a mishap box is included in the overland pack out.

(3) Ensure sufficient T-45 NATOPS manuals, PCLs and pre-mishap plans are current and available ashore and afloat at the CQ DET site.

(4) Provide two CD-RW, one to the Shore DET AOIC and one to Boat DET OIC, with pre-formatted Safety and OPREP messages.

(5) Prepare a risk assessment of DET ORM Issues/Hazards via TRACS 2.0 R in Report Generator located on the Naval Safety Center website (<https://www2.cn.navy.mil/Default.asp>). This will be accomplished no later than five days prior to fly-off and information will be provided to DET OIC for use in briefing aircrew.

e. The TW-1/VT-7/VT-9 Administrative Officer(s) shall:

(1) Fulfill administrative matters pertaining to the CQ DET.

(2) Prepare TAD orders for all applicable squadron personnel.

(3) Request commercial air tickets, non-government billeting and rental transportation from SATO for all applicable personnel.

(4) Coordinate billeting in suitable quarters for all DET personnel.

(5) Ensure all travel claims are filed within five working days of completion of DET.

f. The VT-7/VT-9 OPSO(s) shall:

(1) Coordinate all transportation, berthing, and DET pack out.

g. Shore RDOs shall:

(1) Be a designated Naval Aviator, serving as tower representative ashore whenever any CNATRA aircraft are engaged in CQ operations.

(2) Maintain a current T-45 PCL and phone list to include shore SDO, POTS number to shipboard personnel, and a local field support extension.

h. Shore SDOs shall:

(1) Prepare and maintain shore DET Ready Room and briefing spaces.

(2) Establish CQ DET admin workspace to include phone, fax and email communications.

- (3) Distribute and execute the daily flight schedule.
- (4) Maintain accurate rosters of all DET personnel to include billeting locations and pertinent telephone numbers.
- (5) Maintain current aircraft, airlift, VOD/COD aircraft, passenger, and cargo status.
- (6) Track aircrew flight time, cats, traps, etc.
- (7) Coordinate and track rental vehicle and ground transportation plan.
- (8) Transport instructors/students to and from hangar as required.
- (9) Establish shore based DET mess fund.
- (10) Ensure spaces are properly turned over upon completion of DET.
- (11) Assist AOIC as required ensuring all DET pack out gear is unpacked/used/repacked in an organized and professional manner.
