1. Purpose. To promulgate the schedule and assign responsibilities for a one-day visit by RDML Bull, CNATRA and CAPT Dwyer, PERS-43.

4. Uniform. The uniform for military personnel is the uniform of the day, flight suit, or as briefed. The dress for civilians will be appropriate working attire.

ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

1. CAPT Paul Carelli, Commander Training Wing ONE (CTW-1). Serve as the Official Host.
2. CDR Taz Lumpkin, TW-1 Chief Staff Officer. Serve as TW-1 Liaison Officer and as overall coordinator. Coordinate with Commodore's Secretary and Aide to CNATRA to ensure that vehicle arrangements are in place. Schedule meetings with Squadron Commanding Officers and U.S. Navy Instructor Pilots.
3. LCDR Rapin, TW-1 Operations Officer. Schedule Wing spaces for meeting. Deconflict training operations to facilitate 100% participation.
4. LT Clay, TW-1 Assistant Operations Officer. Provide appropriate "Welcome Aboard" marquee message at flight line entrance. Prepare flight line VIP parking space (1-star slider insert) and hoist the Admiral's Flag. Liaise with Commodore's Secretary and coordinate duty driver responsibilities and command vehicles for use by members of the Admiral's official party.
5. All TW-1 and Squadron Personnel. Ensure all workspaces are clean and presentable.
6. Commanding Officer, NAS Meridian, is requested to provide the following support:
 - a. "Welcome Aboard" marquee (main gate), main side 1-star flag, VIP parking.
 - b. Other Public Affairs, grounds preparation and protocol assistance as may be appropriate.
 - c. Schedule permitting; greet the official party upon arrival.
 - d. Use of Galley facilities is deferred.

Rear Admiral Dell Bull
Chief of Naval Air Training



Rear Admiral Dell Bull is a native of Oak Harbor, Washington. He is a 1988 graduate of the University of Idaho, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Science.

Designated a Naval Flight Officer in September 1989, RDML Bull's early flying assignments as a Bombardier Navigator include VA-128 at NAS Whidbey Island and VA-196 aboard USS Independence (CV 62) during Operation DESERT SHIELD. He was assigned to VF-101 as one of the first NFOs selected for transition to the F-14 Tomcat community and again as an instructor, later reporting to VF-24 aboard the USS Nimitz (CVN 68), flying missions in support of Operation SOUTHERN WATCH, and VF-14 aboard the USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN 71), where he was selected as the NFO of the Year for his combat performance and tactical expertise.

Shore tours include a Legislative Fellow tour with Senator John McCain, Senior Policy Officer on the Joint Staff (J-34 Anti-Terrorism Office), Aviation Program Manager in the Office of Legislative Affairs, and most recently the Chief of

Staff for Commander, Naval Air Forces Pacific (CNAF).

Command operational assignments include the VFA-41 Black Aces aboard USS Nimitz (CVN 68), VFA-122 Flying Eagles, the west coast F/A-18A-F Fleet Replacement Squadron, and Carrier Air Wing NINE aboard USS John C. Stennis (CVN 74).

RDML Bull assumed command as Chief of Naval Air Training in July 2015.

His decorations include the Legion of Merit with two Gold Stars, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2 awards), Air Medal (3 awards with Combat "V"), Strike/Flight Medal (6 awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal with a Gold Star, Navy Achievement Medal (2 awards) and various campaign, unit, and service awards. He has accumulated more than 4,800 flight hours and more than 950 arrested landings.

Captain Dwyer is a native of Alameda, California and a 1988 graduate of the California Maritime Academy with a Bachelor of Science in Marine Transportation and a Third Mates License in the Merchant Marine. He received his Wings of Gold in March 1992 in Meridian Mississippi and orders to fly the F/A-18C in Lemoore, California.

Captain Dwyer's command tours include, from May 2006 to August 2007, Commanding Officer VFA-27 "The Royal Maces", Forward Deployed to NAF Atsugi Japan, flying the F-18E Super Hornet assigned to CVW-5 aboard USS Kitty Hawk (CV-63). During his command tour the Royal Maces were awarded the CNAF Battle "E", McClusky Award for best attack squadron, CNO Safety "S", CSFWP Bruce Carrier Award "Golden Wrench", and Pac Fleet Golden Anchor Award for Sailor Retention. From March 2008 to March 2009, following training at Fort Bragg NC, he served as Commanding Officer of Provincial Reconstruction Team (PRT) Kunar Province, Afghanistan, with a follow on tour at Headquarters International Security and Assistance Force (ISAF), as Director of HQ ISAF PRT Office, overseeing governance and development operations of all 26 PRTs in Afghanistan. From June 2009 to December 2010 he served

as Commanding Officer of VFA-106, the F-18 Fleet Replacement Squadron (FRS) home ported at NAS Oceana Virginia. Captain Dwyer Commanded Carrier Air Wing EIGHT aboard the USS George HW Bush (CVN-77) from May 2012 to November 2013 and Carrier Air Wing SEVENTEEN aboard USS Carl Vinson (CVN-70) from December 2013 to March 2014.

Captain Dwyer's other at-sea tours include two tours with VFA-151 Vigilantes assigned to CVW-2 aboard USS Constellation (CV-64).

Ashore Captain Dwyer's served as SFTI at Strike Fighter Weapons School Pacific where he was selected as the 1997 Commander Strike Fighter Wing Pacific Admiral Wesley McDonald Junior Officer of the Year. As the Hornet Air Combat Placement Officer (p433a) Naval Personnel Command Millington Tennessee and US Naval War College Newport Rhode Island. Captain Dwyer holds a Masters in Foreign Affairs and Strategic Studies and a Masters in Computer Information Science.

Captain Dwyer's decorations include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, Air Medal Strike/Flight, Combat Action Ribbon, Battle E (3 awards), and has accumulated over 3500 F-18 flight hours, and 1166 carrier arrested landings on 11 different aircraft carriers. Captain Dwyer is married to the former Christina Picinich from Alameda, California and they have three great children, Thomas, Kennedy and Rachel.
