Subj: TOBACCO USE IN TRAINING SQUADRON EIGHT SIX

Ref: (a) SECNAVINST 5100.13E  
(b) NASPNCLAINST 5100.2H

1. Purpose. To provide policy guidance on tobacco use and to implement references (a) and (b) in Training Squadron EIGHT SIX.

2. Cancellation. TRARONEIGHTSIXINST 5100.2E

3. Applicability. This instruction applies to all Training Squadron EIGHT SIX military personnel, civilian employees, dependents and visitors while in VT-86 facilities.

4. Background. The Surgeon General of the United States has determined that the use of tobacco products (ie. cigarettes, cigars, dip, chew), as well as exposure to second-hand smoke and tobacco product residues are hazardous to human health. Tobacco products may also adversely impact the health and readiness of our military forces. The health results of using tobacco products are an immense burden on the Department of Defense (DoD) health care system, as a whole.

5. Policy. Provide staff and visitors an environment that is tobacco free and discourages the use of tobacco products (e.g. electronic cigarettes, cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, snuff, pipes, and all other forms of tobacco and smokeless tobacco), promote education about the hazards of tobacco use and encourages and assists tobacco users who wish to quit. The Command policy also provides clear guidelines to those who choose to use tobacco and allow tobacco use in designated smoking areas. The designated smoking areas are the south corner of hangar 1854 and the picnic area adjacent to the trainer building.

6. Action. Smoking will not be permitted in any Training Squadron EIGHT SIX buildings or government vehicles. Personal example by all in leadership and supervisory positions is vital to the success of this policy.

a. The Ground Safety Officer will ensure that suitable "NO SMOKING" signs are posted throughout all squadron spaces and that suitable ashtrays are available in designated smoking areas.

b. General Military Training will include topics on health risks of tobacco use and assistance available for quitting.

c. Advise tobacco users of the risks associated with tobacco use and refer them to the Deployment Health and Wellness Center for information and/or registration for tobacco cessation services.
