Subj: OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH PROGRAM

1. Purpose. To establish procedures for the implementaton of an effective Occupational Health Program with specific emphasis on, but not limited to, hearing conservation, sight conservation, occupational safety and health, driving safety, and injury/death reporting. These procedures are published per the directives established in references (a) through (d).

2. Cancellation. TRARONTENINST 6260.1J

3. Objectives

a. Hearing Conservation. A Hearing conservation program will be managed by the Safety Department Ground Safety Officer. Aircrew will be monitored through annual flight physicals. Protective equipment for the T-6A aircrew will be provided by appropriate gear issue work centers. The Commanding Officer will ensure adequate funding is available for and provide sound prevention devices for all personnel. Protective gear for all other squadron personnel will be provided for and maintained within the individual departments. Any squadron personnel in the flight line area when aircraft engines are turning shall wear hearing protection.

b. Sight Conservation

(1) The Commanding Officer shall ensure adequate funding is available for required protective eyewear.

(2) The chain of command shall verify that personnel, working in areas requiring eye protection listed in reference (b), properly utilize eye protection.

(3) All squadron personnel shall have their helmet visor down when in the T-6A line area while engines are operating.

c. Head Protection. It is recommended that all squadron personnel wear safety cranial helmets or flight helmets any time their feet are not touching the deck while in squadron spaces or on the flight line.

d. Occupational Safety

(1) The Squadron provides the means to improve safety within work centers through a collective feedback system and adherence to the objectives specified therein.

(2) Civilian personnel will have direct access to the GSO for occupational safety and related matters.

e. Occupational Health

(1) All hands are responsible for ensuring compliance with all safety directives, detection of hazards, and reporting hazards, incidents and potential hazards to the Safety Department.

(2) Smoking and tobacco use shall follow the guidelines in reference (c).

f. All squadron personnel are responsible for adherence to and enforcement of the requirements contained in this instruction.
